Fr. Cit's Column

Mission. Jesus' mission is the Church's mission. The Church received from Christ her mission. She listens to God, acts in accord with the plan of God and follows the example of Jesus' ministerial work.

What is mission? Simply, task, a goal set to be accomplished at a given time and place by a particular people or group. Mission, in the language of the Church, is "to send". God sent his Son to save the world through reconciliation and restoration. The Church participates in that mission by being sent herself to the people doing what Jesus did. Apart from liturgy and evangelization, the church engages herself in the world taking care of the needs of all peoples, penetrating their lives if only they would be enlightened of the very nature and character of the God who loves and saves. By virtue of baptism, all the baptized are enjoined to live their Christian vocation wherever they are according to how they live their daily life. Each one is a priest, prophet and king, enabling them through the power of the Holy Spirit to be themselves active partners of God's mission on earth.

The Church is missionary. She's in the community. She is in the homes. She is in schools. She is in workplaces. She is in the streets as she is in the stadiums as she is in the hospitals and graveyards. She is in the places where people need to listen and know the truth. And above all she is where love and justice and peace may be restored and sustained.

As the Church (her faithful persevering members) goes to the mission place, she perseveres to listen to the voice of God doing what God wills. With the direction of the Holy Spirit, the Church strives to be responsive to the needs of the community where she belongs as well as the needs of the world.

Jesus enjoined the Church to be the salt and light of the earth.>

Misión. La misión de Jesús es la misión de la Iglesia. La Iglesia recibió de Cristo su misión. Ella escucha a Dios, actúa de acuerdo con el plan de Dios y sigue el ejemplo de la obra ministerial de Jesús.

¿Qué es la misión? Simplemente, tarea, una meta establecida para ser cumplida en un momento y lugar dado por una persona o grupo en particular. La misión, en el lenguaje de la Iglesia, es «enviar». Dios envía a su Hijo para salvar al mundo a través de la reconciliación y la restauración. La Iglesia participa en esa misión siendo enviada a la gente haciendo lo que Jesús hizo.

Aparte de la liturgia y la evangelización, la Iglesia se dedica al mundo cuidando de las necesidades de todos los pueblos, penetrando en sus vidas si solo ellos se iluminaran de la naturaleza y el carácter mismo del Dios que ama y salva. En virtud del bautismo, todos los bautizados están obligados a vivir su vocación cristiana dondequiera que se encuentren, de acuerdo con la forma en que viven su vida cotidiana. Cada uno es sacerdote, profeta y rey, capacitándoles a través del poder del Espíritu Santo para ser ellos mismos socios activos de la misión de Dios en la tierra.

La Iglesia es misionera. Ella está en la comunidad. Ella está en los hogares. Ella está en la escuela. Ella está en lugares de trabajo. Ella está en las calles como está en los estadios como está en los hospitales y cementerios. Ella está en los lugares donde la gente necesita escuchar y conocer la verdad. Y sobre todo es donde el amor, la justicia y la paz pueden ser restaurados y sostenidos.

Mientras la Iglesia (sus fieles miembros perseverantes) va al lugar de la misión, persevera para escuchar la voz de Dios haciendo lo que Dios quiere. 
