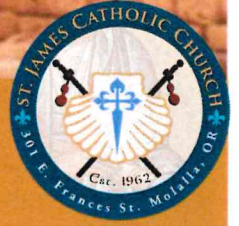

Fr. Cit's Column

Leadership in the church. Servant-leaders. Unlike the known organizational structure of communities or groups, where leaders are the authority from where the success of all the organization is hinged, church leaders are servant-leaders. It means that the leader shepherds the whole community the way Jesus took care of his disciples. He served their needs. But also, he taught them authoritatively about the Kingdom of God, his fulfillment of the will of the Father, his passion to rescue the people the Father gave him, etc. Finally, he went around healing, restoring and rejoining the least, the last and the lost. The church leaders configured in Christ's service must do the same character of leadership.

While all leaders of the church must have Jesus' heart in serving the community of the faithful and God, more particularly demanded from the ordained ministers the premium manner of leading the community of the baptized to the flowing stream of God's love, mercy and goodness.

Bishops and priests must be formed according to the heart of Jesus. As a point of intention to understand, the image of the Good Shepherd provides description to define who our ordained should become or how they should conduct leadership. And we have so many adjectives to consider, for example, selfless, servile, gracious, courageous, merciful...

These, actually, are Christ's *munera* (mission), namely: priestly, prophetic and kingly. Also sanctifying, teaching and governing. In leading the sheep, the Shepherd has to share divine life and order the sheep towards the Kingdom of God. In leading, the minister has to become himself the model, the promoter, and sustainer of the goods of the Kingdom of God. In the church's two thousand plus years of existence, the militant church continues to be taught by the Good Teacher, Jesus, so that her ministers are ordered to what it actually means to be a shepherd. >

Liderazgo en la iglesia. Líderes de servicio. A diferencia de la estructura organizativa conocida de comunidades o grupos, donde los líderes son la autoridad desde donde se articula el éxito de toda la organización, los líderes de la iglesia son líderes sirvientes. Significa que el líder pastorea a toda la comunidad de la misma manera que Jesús cuidó de sus discípulos. Él sirvió a sus necesidades. Pero también, les enseñó con autoridad acerca del Reino de Dios, Su cumplimiento de la voluntad del Padre, Su pasión por rescatar a las personas que el Padre le dio, etc. Finalmente, se fue curando, restaurando y reuniendo a los más pequeños, los últimos y los perdidos. Los líderes de la iglesia configurados en el servicio de Cristo deben hacer el mismo carácter de liderazgo.

Mientras que todos los líderes de la iglesia deben tener el corazón de Jesús en servir a la comunidad de los fieles y de Dios, más particularmente exigió a los ministros ordenados la manera privilegiada de conducir a la comunidad de los bautizados a la corriente fluyendo del amor, la misericordia y la bondad de Dios.

Los obispos y los sacerdotes deben formarse según el Corazón de Jesús. Como punto de intención para entender, la imagen del Buen Pastor proporciona una descripción para definir quién debe ser nuestro ordenado o cómo debe conducir el liderazgo. Y tenemos tantos adjetivos a considerar, por ejemplo, desinteresado, servicial, amable, valiente, misericordioso...

Estos, en realidad, son *munera* de Cristo (misión), a saber: sacerdotal, profético y real.

También santificar, enseñar y gobernar. Al guiar a las ovejas, el Pastor tiene que compartir la vida divina y ordenar a las ovejas hacia el Reino de Dios. Al dirigir, el ministro tiene que llegar a ser él mismo el modelo, el promotor y el sustentador de los bienes del Reino de Dios.

En los más de dos mil años de existencia de la iglesia, la iglesia militante continúa siendo enseñada por el Buen Maestro, Jesús, para que sus ministros sean ordenados a lo que realmente significa ser un pastor.>

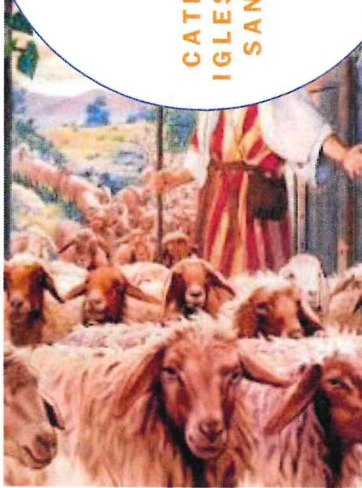

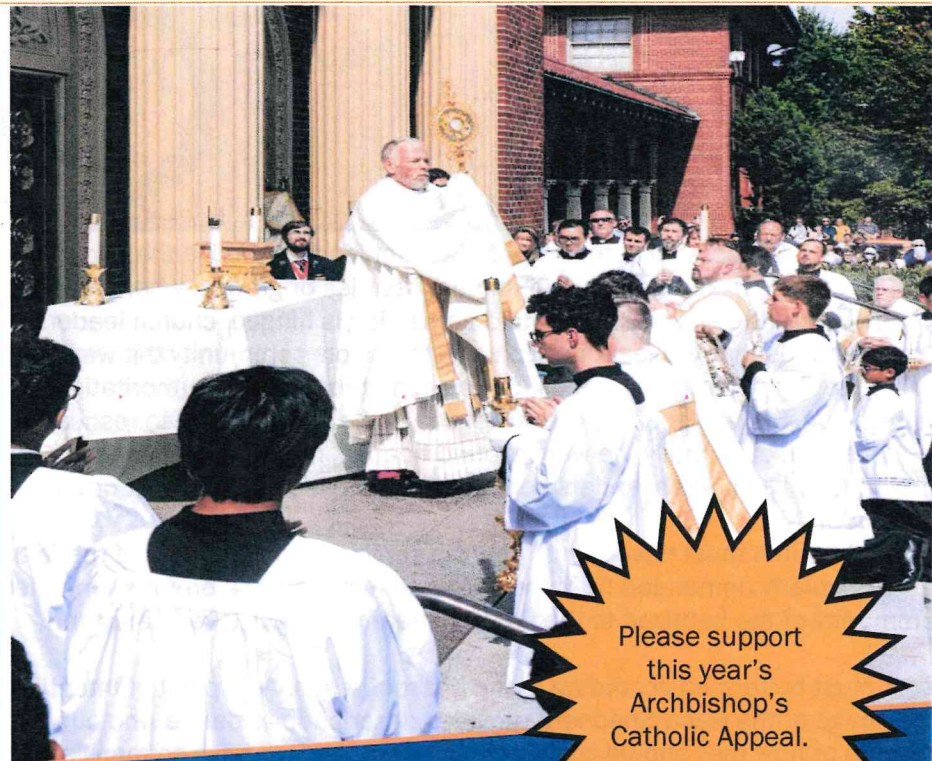

Visiting the Homebound: Making visits to people who cannot get to Mass is a special ministry. It involves a social time for many and a chance to pray with and for the needs of that person. Parish Mission and Vision

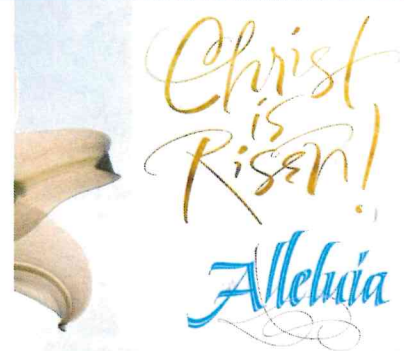
We are a Christian community from varied roots, united by God, guided by St. James the Greater, worshiping, evangelizing and helping each other toward holiness.
