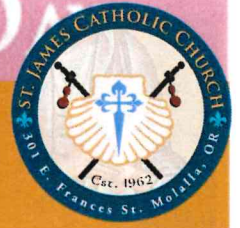

Fr. Cit's Column Mother and teacher. The Church is mother and teacher. The Catechism of the Catholic Church # 2030 and 2031 delineate the Church's nurturing and guiding mission to all the believers and to all people of good will.

Through the sacraments and the Sacred Scriptures, the Church nourishes the mind, heart, soul and body of a disciple and inspire and guide those who are searching for the truth.

The Church cannot be idle and isolate for being where she is, but being where is, she is both impacted and influences the community at large. The separation of the Church and State observed by many independent states provide for rules governing an acknowledgement and encouragement to the right of expression or non-expression of church or faith. With that said, governments that prevent any citizen from speaking and acting on matters that involve social and communal life based on their principles of faith and faith expression violate that guaranteed constitutional right.

As a consequence of the Church's nourishment and guidance, a persevering Christian goes out to the world without any inhibition to live in the manner expected of them. For example, in St. John XIII's encyclical *Mater et Magistra* (Mother and Teacher), the faithful disciple goes out to the world living their Christian character promoting justice, peace and love. Where there is injustice and disorder, the persevering Christian should not be silent and indifferent to the just cause. She encourages and strengthens her children to live their Christian life without blame and inhibition and to seek justice and promote just and humane society in the midst of abuse and injustice.

The Holy Mother Church is always supported by the intercessions of the Holy Mother of God, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and defended by the Holy Spirit advocate.>

Madre y maestra. La Iglesia es madre y maestra. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica #2030 y 2031 delimitan la misión de la Iglesia para nutrir y guiar a todos los creyentes y a todas las personas de buena voluntad.

11 La Iglesia no puede estar ociosa y aislada por estar donde está, pero al estar donde está, se ve afectada e influye en la comunidad en general. La separación entre la Iglesia y el Estado observada por muchos Estados independientes prevé normas que rigen el reconocimiento y el fomento del derecho de expresión o no expresión de la iglesia o la fe. Dicho esto, los gobiernos que impiden a cualquier ciudadano hablar y actuar sobre asuntos que involucran la vida social y comunitaria, basados en sus principios de fe y expresión de fe, violan ese derecho constitucional garantizado.

12 Como consecuencia del alimento y guía de la Iglesia, un cristiano perseverante sale al mundo sin ninguna inhibición para vivir de la manera que se espera de ellos.

Por ejemplo, en la encíclica *Mater et Magistra* (Madre y Maestra) de San Juan XIII, el discípulo fiel sale al mundo viviendo su carácter cristiano promoviendo la justicia, la paz y el amor. Donde hay injusticia y desorden, el cristiano perseverante no debe permanecer callado e indiferente a la causa justa. Ella anima y fortalece a sus hijos a vivir su vida cristiana sin culpa ni inhibición y a buscar justicia y promover una sociedad justa y humana en medio del abuso y la injusticia.

We are a Christian community from varied roots, united by God, guided by St. James the Greater, worshiping, evangelizing and helping each other toward holiness.

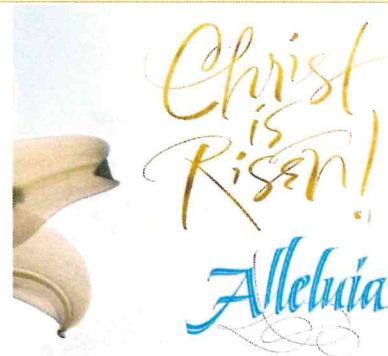
