Fr. Cit's Column

Stewardship. God created the world and all things on it. Genesis 1:27-30 tells us that God created human beings and made them the "crown jewel" of creation. God gave them dominion over all things created. The Catechism of the Catholic Church 2402 and subsequent paragraphs explain that the very purpose of humanity placed at the top of all creation is the sacred duty of stewardship. Co-responsibility. We share with God the duty to take care and reproduce the creation. As well as we are co-responsible with each other to use, share and replenish the goods of the world.

Stewardship is also pro-people. That means, each person is rewarded reflexively as each steward concerns toward the good of the other. The more you give, the more you receive. While reward must not be the motivation of every kind of steward, however be assured that "there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the Gospel who will not receive a hundred times more" (see Mark 10:29)

Stewardship is care for creation. Everything is wealth. Exploiting the resources available for progress is harmonious to the plan of God. However, far more harmonious with God's plan is to save for the future. By thinking of the generations ahead, we divest ourselves of greed and selfishness our heart is only focused on the important: God is the joy of our life.

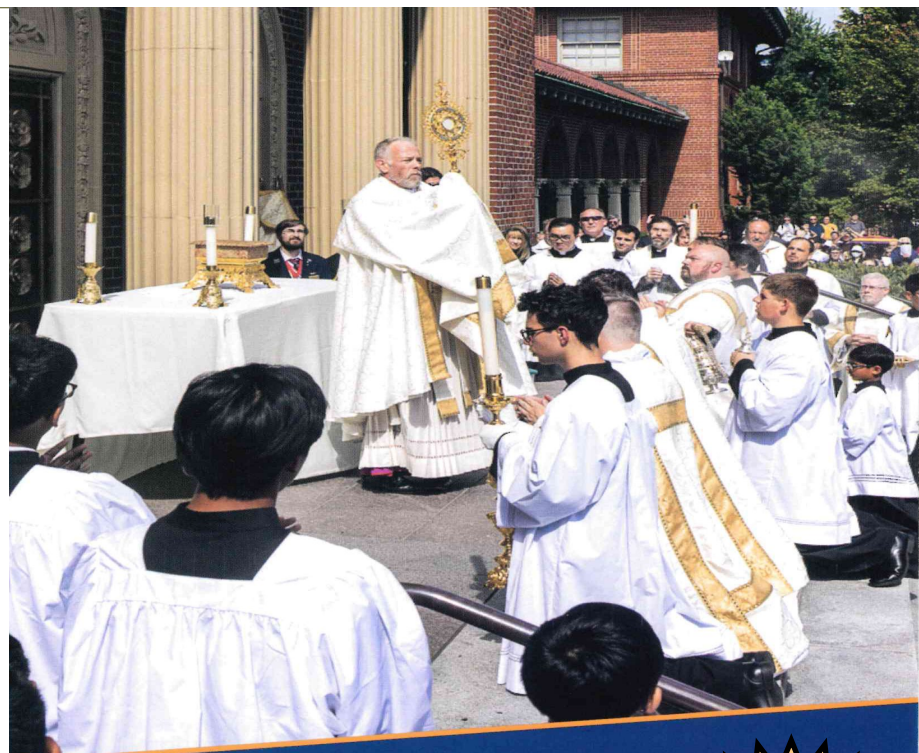
A blessed Christian knows how exactly how to live a blessed life. They have not because they possess wealth or power of name, but because they serve God and serve each other.

Dios les dio dominio sobre todas las cosas creadas. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 2402 y los párrafos posteriores explican que el propósito mismo de la humanidad colocado en la cima de toda creación es el sagrado deber de la mayordomía. Coresponsabilidad. Compartimos con Dios el deber de cuidar y reproducir la creación. Así como somos coresponsables entre nosotros para usar, compartir y reponer los bienes del mundo. La administración también es pro-gente. Eso significa que cada persona es recompensada reflexivamente mientras cada mayordomo se preocupa por el bien del otro. Cuanto más das, más recibes. Mientras que la recompensa no debe ser la motivación de todo tipo de mayordomo, sin embargo, tenga la seguridad de que "no hay quien haya abandonado casa, hermanos, hermanas, madre, padre, hijos o tierras por mi causa y por el Evangelio, quien no reciba cien veces más" (véase Marcos 10:29). La administración es el cuidado de la creación. Todo es riqueza. Explotar los recursos disponibles para el progreso es armonioso con el plan de Dios. Sin embargo, mucho más armonioso con el plan de Dios es ahorrar para el futuro. Al pensar en las generaciones venideras, nos despojamos de la codicia y el egoísmo, nuestro corazón solo se centra en lo importante: Dios es la alegría de nuestra vida. Un cristiano bendecido sabe exactamente cómo vivir una vida bendecida. No lo han hecho porque posean riqueza o poder de nombre, sino porque sirven a Dios y se sirven entre ellos.
