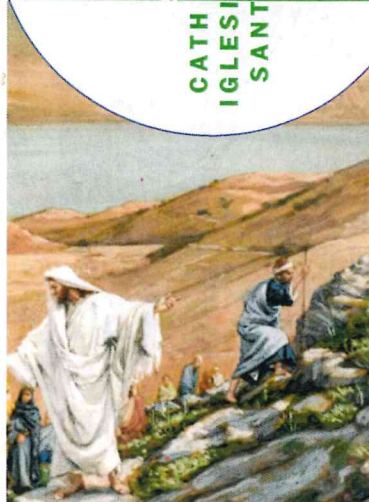
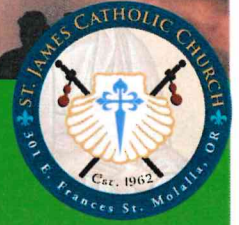

Fr. Cit's Column

Common priesthood of all the baptized. Ministerial priesthood of the ordained. By virtue of our Baptism, we share a common priesthood (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1535). Common priesthood means we are all witnesses of Christ, for receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit through initiation, we are empowered to use the power of the gifts of the Holy Spirit to bless, guide and help the peoples of the world with the vision of the heavenly Kingdom of God as basis of the munera (work).

Be salt and light (Matthew 5:13). Living in the world, Christians must impact the whole society not the other way around. But if Christians have become flat and their light is hidden in a bushel basket, the contrary happens. That explains why in our age, our culture, politics and economics are lawful, and yet immoral.

For all of us involved in the church, Christ's commission makes all of us Christ's partners in the mission.

The ordained ministers, bishops, priests and deacons, have a role distinct from the common priesthood of all the baptized. Distinct because by virtue of their ordination (and or consecration), they are made to dispense responsibilities attached to their office. A priest's office, as cooperators of the local ordinary (or bishop) is to teach, sanctify and lead. If the bishop leads the communities of parishes in a diocese, the priest leads the baptized of a particular parish or chapel.

As the community's leader, the priest organizes all the baptized to ensure that all sacraments are properly celebrated and made available for the growth of the spiritual life of the community and to help them live their Christian values in the community where they live.>

Sacerdocio común de todos los bautizados. Sacerdocio ministerial de los ordenados. Por virtud de nuestro Bautismo, compartimos un sacerdocio común (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 1535). El sacerdocio común significa que todos somos testigos de Cristo; al recibir los dones del Espíritu Santo a través de la iniciación, estamos capacitados para usar el poder de los dones del Espíritu Santo para bendecir, guiar y ayudar a los pueblos del mundo con la visión del Reino celestial de Dios como base de la munera (obra).

Sé sal y luz (Mateo 5:13). Viviendo en el mundo, los cristianos deben influir en toda la sociedad, no al revés. Pero si los cristianos se han vuelto planos y su luz está oculta en una cesta de fanega, ocurre lo contrario. Eso explica por qué en nuestra época, nuestra cultura, política y economía son legales y, sin embargo, inmorales.

Todos estamos involucrados, porque la iglesia, a través de la comisión de Cristo, nos convierte en socios de Cristo en la misión.

Los ministros ordenados, obispos, sacerdotes y diáconos tienen un papel distinto al sacerdocio común de todos los bautizados. Distintos porque, en virtud de su ordenación (y/o consagración), se les obliga a impartir responsabilidades asociadas a su cargo. El oficio de un sacerdote, como cooperativo del ordinario local (o obispo), es enseñar, santificar y liderar. Si el obispo lidera las comunidades de parroquias en una diócesis, el sacerdote dirige a los bautizados de una parroquia o capilla en particular.

Como líder de la comunidad, el sacerdote organiza a todos los bautizados para asegurar que todos los sacramentos sean debidamente celebrados y disponibles para el crecimiento de la vida espiritual de la comunidad, y para ayudarles a vivir sus valores cristianos en la comunidad donde viven.>
