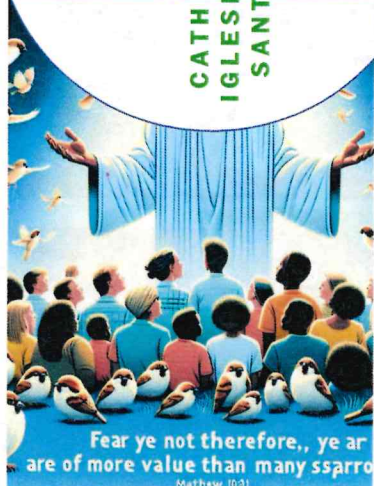
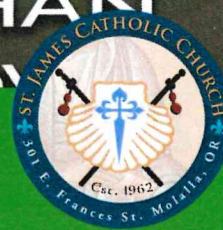

Fr. Cit's Column

Munera, ae. Latin for work. Work, in Ancient Rome, refers to the Empire's program of services to the people of Rome, which may cover loosely as amusements or strictly as public needs such as health, safety and food security.

In the Catholic Tradition, the Church's work refers to the offices of Jesus Christ by which all are called to cooperate through the Church as priests (worship), prophets (teach truth) and kings (serve the community).

In Christifidelis Laici (On the Vocation and Mission of the Lay Faithful), Apostolic Exhortation, John Paul II, 1989, the laity is called by Christ and sent to the world to share the Good News of salvation to the society. Therefore, every baptized is called back to the church to be trained (or equipped) in faith and missionary work, opposing the controverted widespread secularism and religious indifference, so that they may truly live their Christian vocation (the call to holiness) within the society as they live their family, social and professional lives.

The world is a mission field. Every baptized person is a missionary. Or simply, a baptized is Christ's partner in making the Truth known to all the world. Do they have to preach and explain the Gospel? As witnesses of Christ, words are not enough. In fact, the best way to teach the Good News to others is to be the personification of the Beatitudes.

In other words, you do not have to reinvent yourself to be Christ's partner and cooperator. Renewed by Christ's love, live in and with love. Christ's passion is love for the people of God. He died for us because he loves us.

En la Tradición Católica, la obra de la Iglesia se refiere a los oficios de Jesucristo por los cuales todos están llamados a cooperar a través de la Iglesia como sacerdotes (adoración), profetas (enseñan la verdad) y reyes (sirven a la comunidad).

En Christifidelis Laici (Sobre la vocación y misión de los fieles laicos), Exhortación apostólica, Juan Pablo II, 1989, Cristo llama al laicado y se envía al mundo para compartir la Buena Nueva de la salvación con la sociedad. Por lo tanto, todo bautizado es llamado de nuevo a la iglesia para ser formado (o equipado) en la fe y el trabajo misionero, oponiéndose al controvertido secularismo generalizado y la indiferencia religiosa, para que puedan vivir verdaderamente su vocación cristiana (el llamado a la santidad) dentro de la sociedad mientras viven su vida familiar, social y profesional.

El mundo es un campo misionero. Toda persona bautizada es misionera. O simplemente, un bautizado es el compañero de Cristo para hacer la Verdad conocida a todo el mundo.

¿Tienen que predicar y explicar el Evangelio? Como testigos de Cristo, las palabras no son suficientes. De hecho, la mejor manera de enseñar la Buena Nueva a otros es ser la personificación de las Bienaventuranzas.

En otras palabras, no tienes que reinventarte para ser el compañero y cooperativo de Cristo. Renovados por el amor de Cristo, vivid en y con amor. La pasión de Cristo es el amor por el pueblo de Dios. Murió por nosotros porque nos quiere.

De la misma manera, como testigos del amor de Jesús, cumplimos nuestras responsabilidades ordinarias y diarias con amor. El amor hace que toda obra de iglesia sea cristiana.>
