Fr. Cit's Column

Letting go, losing, leaving. No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one or love the other...you cannot serve God and mam-

mon (Matthew 6:24).

Christian discipleship is easy if one has the heart to not hold on to things that have value on earth, for they do not last. They corrode. Thus, in the event of their demise, what is left of the man who has? From the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away (Matthew 13:12). Save for the treasures of heaven.

During my formative years, I knew from keen observation that I don't have things my classmates have. My parents have made us understand that our lack of provisions should never discourage us, instead it should drive us to work hard if we want to change our situation.

It was a hard life; I lost my childhood. That time I did not know it was that bad. I thought it was normal that we have to help our parents earn for a living. No, I did not curse that. In fact, I thank the Lord for putting me in that situation, otherwise I could have wallowed wastefully my time and energy playing basketball. Wastefully because let us say I learned to make a good play in basketball, do you think a team will draft me?

Glad I learned to use my time helping my parents earn a living. I was a small-time businessman peddling in the neighborhood snacks my parents made. I also learned to earn money by doing practical service, like farm work.

And then at 18, I lost my Dad. It was not too difficult to navigate it because I already know responsibility. The need to be responsible at all times was intensified due to the demand to keep the family afloat. I knew I did not do great, but more importantly that part of my life gave me dose of life lessons. One of those lessons I still use productively is to not hold on to things. As a priest, detachment a saving grace.

As I leave you, I thank you all for your patience and understanding. I will bring with me all the great lessons I learned from you.>

De hecho, le agradezco al Señor por ponerme en esa situación, de lo contrario podría haber desperdiciado mi tiempo y energía jugando al baloncesto. Desperdiciar porque digamos que aprendí a hacer una buena jugada en el baloncesto, ¿crees que un equipo me reclutará?

Me alegro de haber aprendido a usar mi tiempo ayudando a mis padres a ganar dinero. Yo era un hombre de negocios de poca monta que vendía en los bocadillos del vecindario que mis padres preparaban. También aprendí a ganar dinero haciendo servicio práctico, como el trabajo agrícola.

Y luego, a los 18 años, perdí a mi padre. No fue demasiado difícil navegar porque ya conozco la responsabilidad. La necesidad de ser responsable en todo momento se intensificó debido a la demanda de mantener a flote a la familia. Sabía que no me iba muy bien, pero lo más importante es que parte de mi vida me dio dosis de lecciones de vida. Una de esas lecciones que todavía uso productivamente es no aferrarme a las cosas. Como sacerdote, el desapego es una gracia salvadora.

Al dejarlos, les agradezco a todos por su paciencia y comprensión. Traeré conmigo todas las grandes lecciones que aprendí de ti.>

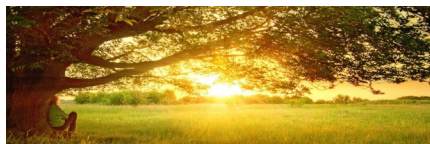

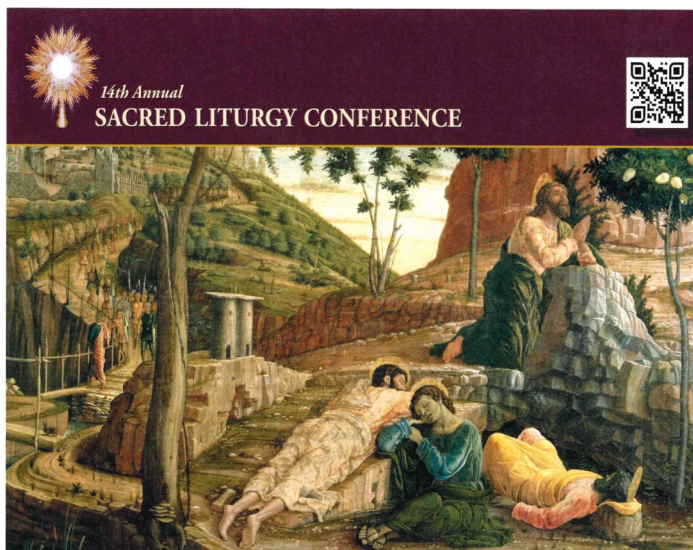

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Visiting the Homebound: Making visits to people who cannot get to Mass is a special ministry. It involves a social time for many and a chance to pray with and for the needs of that person.
